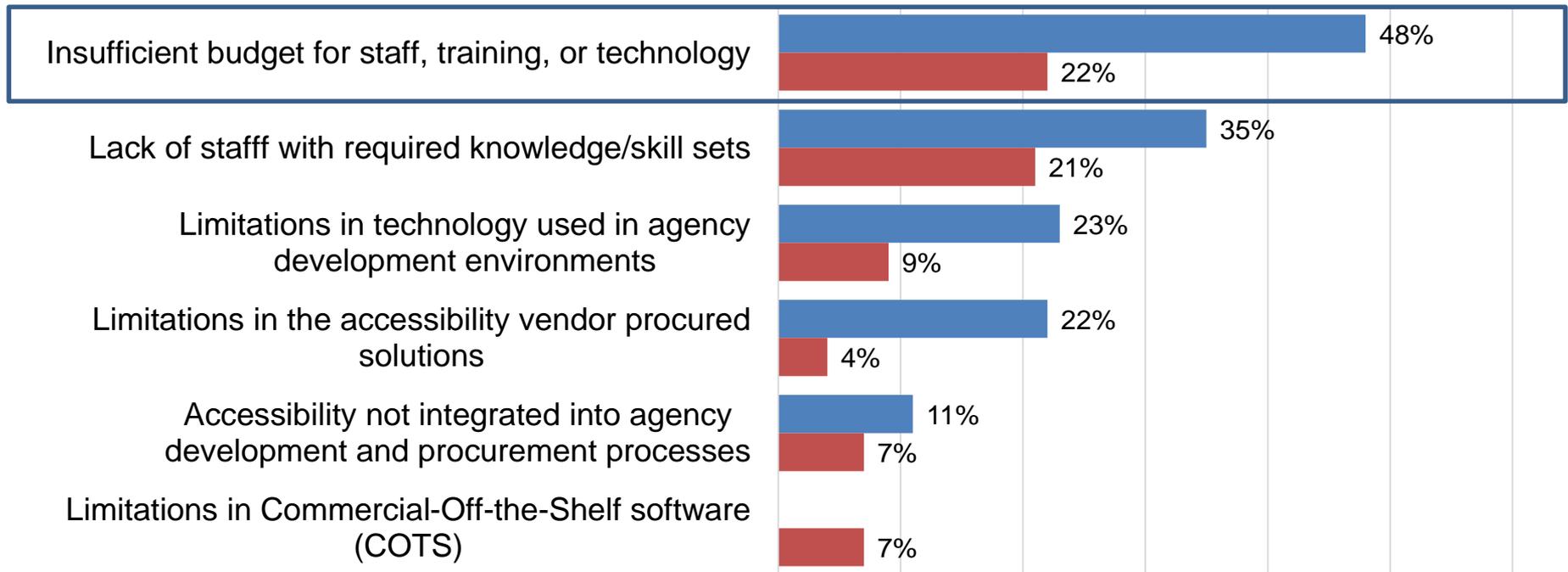

Statewide Agency Internet Scanning: DIR Project Objectives

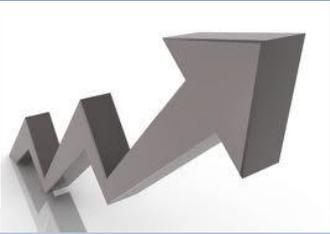
- Drive enterprise wide progress in web accessibility by providing automated site checking services
 - The statutory basis for DIR providing such a service is defined Texas Governmental Code:
 - Sec. 2054.452...provide training for and technical assistance to state agencies
 - Sec. 2054.458....development and monitoring of state agency Internet websites...
- Use the scanning program as a springboard for agencies to adopt (invest in) additional scan capabilities for their internet / intranet environments

What is Accessibility Web Scanning?

- **An automated tool or service for identifying accessibility errors on websites**
 - “spiders” websites searching for specific or missing accessibility criteria
 - Uses defined (Section 508, WCAG 2.0, etc.) or customized standards
 - Reports on error type, location, frequency and other valuable information
 - Generates reports and maintains key historical data
 - Highly scalable
 - Can be installed by customer or hosted as a service
 - DIR uses hosted services
- **Can not check against all accessibility standards**
 - Manual testing of representative web pages is still needed



EIR Web Accessibility Scanning Program



Assisted agencies in making their public websites accessible The service provided agencies the ability to:

- Increase accessibility compliance levels of agency public websites
- Obtain precise, critical accessibility information about a subset of an agency's live public website that might not otherwise be available / affordable
- Utilize the reported information and supporting resources to remediate identified accessibility issues
- Mitigate risk to the state through demonstration that progress is being made and initiative taken to create an inclusive IT environment
- Lay the groundwork for agencies to establish accessibility baselines, goals, and metrics to track progress

WCAG 2.0 AA

Why is DIR launching a new program?

- Benefits per the 2012 program plus additional features
- To prepares Texas agencies for transition of websites to pending new accessibility technical standard WCAG 2.0 AA
 - Current industry standard for web accessibility worldwide
 - Planned for adoption by US Section 508 in early 2015
 - Texas TAC rules will be revised to use WCAG 2.0 AA shortly after revised 508 is adopted to remain in sync

Scan Results, Data Ownership and Sharing

- Scan results are owned by the receiving agency.
- Receiving agency will have access to only the data applicable to itself.
- DIR will have access to agency results to
 - Support agencies with their reports and technical questions
 - Use for analysis and metrics at the enterprise level
- DIR will not share individual agency results with 3rd parties, without written agency approval
 - Public information or legislative requests will be referred to participating agencies or responded to jointly with DIR
